

It would be helpful to responders to your message if the information you glean is repeated in subsequent postings rather than simply being acknowledged. That being said, here is the data amassed from my studies of Ormsby County and its residents.

Hans Marcus Andersen (b. 1839 Germany of Danish parents (probably Schleswig-Holstein, a Danish Province invaded and annexed to Germany in 1864 by Otto von Bismarck of Prussia); d. 1922; buried Lone Mountain Cemetery; a farmer in 1880&1920; husband of Christina; resided Carson Valley, Douglas Co., NV before relocating to Ormsby County. Hans Marcus Andersen immigrated from Denmark to Clinton Co., IA 1880. He then emigrated to California but settled in Ormsby County in 1897 and purchased a ranch from the Phillips estate at the edge of Carson City at the base of Kings Canyon. His holdings remained in the family until the property was sold for housing development. The original ranch house, a two story, white, New England influenced archetype, may still be in existence on the original site.

Christiana Andersen nee ?; b. 1852; d. 1941; buried Lone Mountain Cemetery; b. Germany of Danish parents (See above); wife of Hans M. Andersen (1880 Ormsby Co NV census - Jennie b. Prussia 1854)

Harry Emitt Anderson; b. 1887 NV; d. 1967; buried Lone Mountain Cemetery; son of Hans and Christina; a rancher in 1920; resided 502 Caroline St., Carson City, NV 1920

Mabel L. Anderson nee ?; b. 1886; d. 1968; buried Lone Mountain Cemetery; wife of Harry; mother of Lorin, Harold, and Edelene

Carson City may seek help to buy Buzzy's Ranch

Though it was only a progress report meant for members of the Carson City Planning Commission, many residents were interested in how negotiations are faring between city officials and the owners of Buzzy's Ranch.

The Robert Lorin Andersen and the Jimmie Pete Jarrard children's trusts agreed in January to halt any action that would result in the land being developed - at least until the city had a chance to make an offer for the land.

"Hopefully we can be hiking out there in a year or two," said Joe Childs, a member of the group Save Buzzy's Ranch. "I'm still encouraged."

An appraiser was chosen last month to determine the worth of the approximately 480 acres near the Carson River. This price should be determined by the end of the year. The city can't offer any more than the current market value price for the land, Guzman said.

The total might exceed \$2.4 million - the appraised value of the site in mid-2004. While area land prices have been on the rise during the past couple of years, "we'll need to figure out what the cost will be," Guzman said.

This is why the city may pursue grants to offset the cost and may seek to form a partnership to buy the site, depending on the outcome of this latest appraisal, he said.

While the property owners have received offers for the land during the years, they have resisted and instead have tried to work with the city. Developing it won't come cheap because of infrastructure needs.

The location's ecological benefits are numerous too, according to experts.

In January, the owners were seeking to increase the density for possible residential development before undergoing a change of heart and decided to give the city first choice of purchase.

Silver Saddle Ranch, south of Buzzy's, is owned by the federal Bureau of Land Management and serves as open space, allowing access to the river and Prison Hill area. The BLM considered acquiring Buzzy's several years ago. Riverview Park sits to the north. Buzzy's is bordered by the river on the east and Mexican Ditch to the west.

Guzman said he believes the issue will be resolved early next year.

In other Planning Commission business:

- The special-use permit issued more than a year ago for a billboard on Highway 50 was granted a year-long extension for the sign to be put up. Commissioners did so with trepidation, however, citing traffic safety concerns. The location, D&D Autos, 2794 Highway 50 East, wasn't recommended by this panel during its initial approval process. The supervisors narrowly approved it at that time.
- The tentative plan for Newport Village - 43 homes on a 5.4-acre site in the 3800 block of East Nye Lane was recommended. Though the location at East Nye and College Parkway near the Carson City Airport is designated as a mobile home site, this proposal calls for typical home construction and is appropriate in that type of area, according to the city planning division.

Ira Russell "Andy" Andersen Pioneer Pilot and Carson City Native Pioneer jet pilot and Nevada native son, Ira Russell (Andy) Andersen, died at his family home in Carson City on Nov. 1st. Andy was born in 1921 on the shores of Washoe Lake and grew up on Home Ranch on Kings Canyon Road in Carson City. Home Ranch was originally established as a farm by Andy's grandparents, Hans and Christiana who emigrated from Denmark in 1870. Andy was one of five children born to Harry and Mabel Andersen who, in 1926, converted Home Ranch into a cattle operation. Andy graduated from Carson City High School in 1937 at the age of 16 and went to California to pursue his dream of flying airplanes. During the glory years of aviation he rose to the top of Pan American World Airways, and was dubbed "Pioneer Pilot of the Jumbo Jet" in 1969 as the first pilot to fly the 747 jet on its inaugural runs around the world. His life in aviation began in aeronautical school in Sacramento. He soloed in 1940 in a J3 Piper Cub and in the same year received his commercial license. In 1942, at the age of 21, he was hired by Pan American World Airways. During WWII PAA pilots were commissioned as Navy ensigns with the Naval Air Transport Service transporting military personnel and cargo in and out of Pearl Harbor and throughout the Pacific. Beginning with the China Clipper, Andy flew nearly every plane in the PAA fleet on world wide routes - many of them inaugural runs - throughout the Far East, South America, the Middle East and Europe. He was Pan Am's Chief Pilot-Pacific, and later was named Director of Operations-Pacific in the mid 1960's. Andy retired from Pan Am in 1981, but continued to fly his home built Thorpe, Grumman Tiger, and Cessna 310 for many more years. Andy logged over 38,000 hours in the cockpit. After retiring, Andy and his wife Jeanne divided their time between Carson City and their San Francisco Bay Area home. They spent considerable time restoring the original family house on Kings Canyon Road, known as Home Ranch. Jeanne preceded him in death in 1990. Andy is survived by his daughter Kim; his grandchildren Christopher and Meagen; his great grandsons John and Ewan, and his partner, Claire. He is also survived by several nieces and nephews in California and Nevada, including Michael Andersen of Carson City. Andy's ashes will be scattered from the air over his hay meadows and his beloved Sierras. Memorial luncheons are planned in Carson City on November 29th at the Silver Oaks Golf Club, and on December 1st in the Bay Area. Please call 775-882-5415 if you wish to attend either.
