A. CALL TO ORDER - Mayor Masayko called the meeting to order at 12:19 p.m. A roll call was taken and a quorum was present.

C. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE - Mayor Masayko led the Pledge of Allegiance.

C. PUBLIC COMMENT - None.

AGENDA ITEM

ACTION ON RESOLUTION TO LEVY THE FY 97-98 AD VALOREM TAX RATE AS CERTIFIED BY THE NEVADA STATE TAX COMMISSION - (1-0021.5) Mr. Kramer explained that the base rate for this year is \$2.5609 per hundred dollars of evaluation. He added this was up four mils from last year when it was \$2.5567 and, although it is an increase, it is as close as no increase as can be expected in the current climate. He stated that the tax bills will be sent out the week of July 14. Mr. Kramer also said the rate was offset by the reduction in the school bond debt. Supervisor Smith commented that the operating funds are something City has traditionally been able to hold the line on. He also noted that the tax in the early 90s was in the \$2.7000 range. He said the only two communities in the state that have a lower tax rate are Boulder City and Mesquite, neither of which are full service communities and use volunteer fire departments, etc. He also explained that the City gets 35-40 percent of the ad valorem tax with the rest going to the state, the School District, etc. He also noted that the big revenue generator for the City is sales tax and that it should continue which helps keep the property tax low. At this point Ms. Walker provided copies of the Final Budget Fact Book for FY 97-98. She then provided detailed information on how the figures had been developed and what they represent. Supervisor Smith then moved that the Board of Supervisors adopt Resolution 1997-R-27, a resolution to levy the fiscal year 97-98 ad valorem tax rate as certified by the Nevada State Tax Commission. Supervisor Bennett seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0.

There being no further business Mayor Masayko entertained a motion to adjourn. Supervisor Bennett moved to adjourn. Mayor Masayko seconded the motion. Motion carried 5-0. Mayor Masayko adjourned the meeting at 12:37 p.m.
