A special "Breakfast with Senator Bryan" meeting was held on Tuesday, August 15, 1995, at the Carson City Nugget Convention Center, Room A, 507 North Carson Street, Carson City, Nevada, beginning at 7:30 a.m.

At approximately 7:35 a.m. Mayor Teixeira welcomed the approximate 100 individuals in attendance. (A majority of the Board did not set at the same table.) At approximately 8:15 a.m. Mayor Teixeira convened the meeting. Roll call was taken. The entire Board was present constituting a quorum. Mayor Teixeira welcomed the audience and introduced various Dignitaries and special guests. He then introduced Senator Bryan. Senator Bryan introduced his staff and thanked the audience for attending. He then explained the status of various deficient reduction programs, stressed the need to balance the budget, and noted the difficulties encountered in attempting to find programs which could be eliminated. He felt certain that there would be welfare reforms adopted. Several reforms were noted including block grants, restrictions on the length of time an individual could receive benefits, mandated gainful employment/training programs, educational programs, etc. He felt certain that Federal freeway/highway grants will not be as lucrative as they have been in the past. He did not support Medicare cuts although Congress may pass a funding reduction. The impact such a reduction would have was noted. (1-296-A) He then fielded questions from the audience concerning the impact such Medicare cuts would have on local governments, the need to provide flexibility in the block grant process, his knowledge of the bombing of Guy Pence's residence and his support for debate rather than violent acts of this nature, whether the Federal government would ever have a "balanced" budget as mandated for States and local governments, reasons the Gramm-Rudman Act which mandates a balanced budget will fail, the future for many of the current federally sponsored volunteer programs, his view of the Bosnia situation and NATO's role in it, the potential need for US intervention in getting NATO forces out of Bosnia, the change in plans for Yucca Mountain which may utilize it as an "interim" nuclear storage site, (1-001-B) regulatory control over hazardous materials including pollution issues created by adjacent Countries, and his feeling that affordable housing issues should be addressed by local governments. Mayor Teixeira thanked the audience and Seantor Bryan for coming and participating. There being no other matters for discussion, the meeting was adjourned by mutual consent. No formal action was taken nor required.
