Background/Issues & Analysis

The priorities identified in the Community Health Needs Assessment were discussed, analyzed, then voted on by an electronic poll with the ability to vote for more than one priority. As a result of the poll, the top five priorities were Behavioral Health (Mental Health and Substance Abuse); Access to Healthcare; Housing and Cost of Living; Nutrition - Food Insecurity and Access; and Public Health Infrastructure; and Workforce Development and Built Environment/Physical Activity. The committee decided that the Behavioral Health and Affordable Housing were being addressed by the Carson City Behavioral Health Task Force and the Workforce Housing (initially titled Affordable Housing) subcommittee of that task force and will become part of the CHIP. Three CHIP subcommittees were formed with representation from various individuals and organizations to address Access to Healthcare, Nutrition - Food Insecurity and Access, and Public Health Workforce Development, which was expanded to include a more broad inclusion of the General Workforce (ranked 6th) after the subcommittee reviewed the State of Nevada's Governor's Report titled "In-Demand Occupations: Leveraging Labor-Market Data with Industry Insights to Strategically Align Nevada's Education and Workforce " published January 2017. Tobacco Prevention and Control is a core grant funded program within CCHHS and will continue to be part of the CHIP.
