Background/Issues & Analysis

Based on discussion and direction to staff at the April Range Task Force meeting, staff conducted a market analysis regarding fees and charges for public shooting ranges in the region. The Task Force recommended that a fee schedule consider options for drop-in use, annual permits, independent contractor agreements, accommodations for Veterans, and group reservations. Further, it was recommended that all revenue be reinvested back into the facility to support operations, maintenance, and improvements to the range.

1. Public Shooters - Individuals	\$5/vehicle per day

a. Adults	\$75
b. Youth (17 and under) and Seniors (65+)	\$50
c. Veterans	Free
d. Volunteers (requires minimum of 40 hours of service)	Free
3. Group reservations	
a. Non-profit organizations, Shooting Clubs	\$4/shooter (minimum 10) per day
b. Business/Commercial [Training and education; ammunition and firearms testing; security and armed guard certifications etc.] (requires Carson City business license)	\$8/shooter (minimum 10) per day or Independent Contractor Agreement with revenue 70% to Business 30% to City
c. Governmental Uses (Law Enforcement, Military)	Free
d. Cancellation fee (15 days or less)	\$30
e. Clean up	Actual cost of labor hours or as determined by Director
4. Vendor fee (requires Carson City business license)	\$250 or as determined by Director
5. Concession and sales (targets, ear protection etc.)	Actual cost of items or as determined by Director
6. Private Range Rental/Special Event	\$500-\$2500 or as determined by Director. Requires deposit.
7. Sponsorships	
a. Directional/Education signs	\$500 per year
b. Kiosk	\$750 Per year
c. Target stands, Envelopes, Parking Permits etc.	Actual cost of item or as determined by Director
d. Banners	\$250 for three months

Group reservations: Require insurance, individual participant waivers, Range Safety Officers. Reserve a portion of the facility, but do not have exclusive use of the entire facility, as some portions may still be open and available to the general public or other user groups.

Independent Contractors: Requires Carson City business license, insurance, Range Safety Officers.

City will advertise classes on social media, flyers and inactivity guide; city to provide on-line reservations for classes.

Revenue: All revenue from fees, charges and sponsorships will go back into operations, maintenance, equipment, and/or improvements to the range.

Annual Passes: Require individual waivers and may require an annual on-line or in-person range orientation by a Range Safety Officer.
