**Staff Summary:** Ross Gold Park is one of the city's oldest parks. This item will review the process and public feedback received in an effort to update the park's master plan, which is 46 years old.

## **Previous Action**

1972 – The Board of Supervisors approved the Southside Park Master Plan.

## **Background/Issues & Analysis**

Ross Gold Park, originally called Southside Park, is one of the City's oldest parks. Acquired in the 1960's through a Recreation and Public Purpose Lease from the Bureau of Land Management, the park was developed in the 1970's-1980's with Residential Construction Tax and a Land and Water Conservation Fund (LWCF) grant.

With the majority of the park infrastructure being original, significantly aging and beyond repair, staff has been pursuing efforts to leverage available funding to rehabilitate and reimagine the park. The playground was beyond repair, no longer met safety standards and has recently been replaced with the City's first universally accessible playground. The picnic pavilion was removed at the recommendation of the City Building Official, as it had rotted out and become a safety concern. The restroom is not accessible and in need of updating, and will soon be renovated thanks to a Community Development Block Grant.

While grant efforts were underway, staff embarked in an effort to seek public feedback regarding their vision for the future of the park. An on-line survey had 135 respondents. Based on the survey responses and staff feedback from parks, public works and public safety, a draft master site plan was developed. A public meeting was held at Firehouse #53 on June 27, 2019, with over 30 attendees. Staff then revised the draft plan based on feedback at the public meeting.

The proposed plan incorporates improved parking, sidewalk and path connectivity, reduction and relocation of the irrigation pond, turf reduction, increased native and pollinator landscape areas, accommodations for pickle ball and tennis, covered pavilions, seating, bocce ball, and security improvements for public safety. The design

considerations include low impact development standards to reduce water usage, increase accessibility and disperse recreation areas.

Survey results, a public meeting summary and the draft plan update is provided for the Commission's consideration.

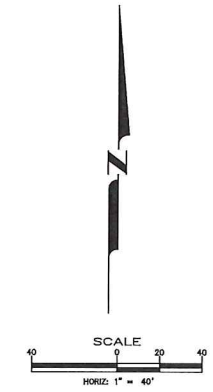
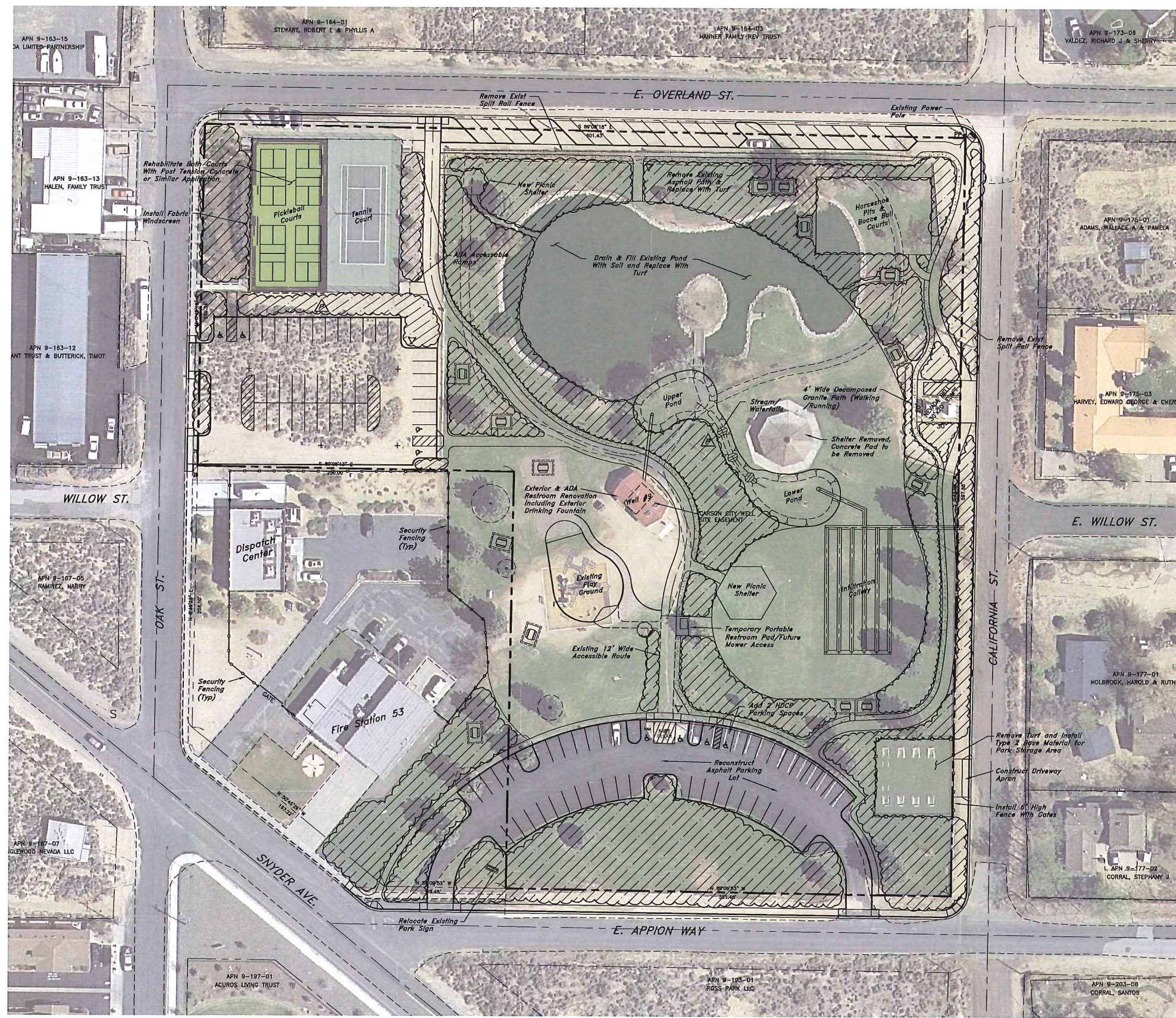

# City explains Ross Gold Park changes

Attendees at a public meeting about Ross Gold Park said they walked away with a better understanding of the rationale behind proposed changes there.

Parks, Recreation and Open Space held the meeting Thursday to get feedback on the park's master plan after receiving 136 responses to a survey conducted in April.

The master plan includes a major redesign of the popular recreation area off Snyder Avenue in south Carson City.

Already, a new playground with universally-accessible equipment has been installed and will be unveiled in the next few weeks. The bathrooms, too, will be made handicap accessible in the next phase. And a large pavilion has been removed.

"The shelter is a very important part of the park. It provides shelter, people hold parties there," said Vern Krahn, senior park planner.

Under the proposed design, the pavilion will be replaced with

two picnic shelters, one medium-sized, the other small.

The biggest change for some, though, is a proposal to remove the large irrigation pond there and replace it with a water feature that includes two, much smaller ponds.

"The pond is why people come here," said Dean Wright, a neighbor to the park, when he first arrived at the meeting, held next to the park at Fire Station 53. "Children come to feed the critters."

The pond, though, is

initially was opposed to removing the pond said he changed his mind.

"I agree with the position on the big pond," said Steve Waclo, a Carson City resident.

Another attendee felt similarly.

"We need to be conscious of water usage and if it's having trouble we need to look at it," said Maurice White, another resident.

The other proposed changes at the park include reducing turf and adding natural landscaping, adding more parking, relocating the horseshoe pit, making the tennis courts usable for pickleball, too, and connecting a series of sidewalks around it for a continuous concrete walking path.

The city is accepting comments on the master plan until July 9 and then will take a draft to the Parks and Recreation Commission in August, where the public can also comment.

likely leaking. Public Works found in 2018 it used four times the water it had in recent years, said Krahn. In early spring, the pond was filled up, not used for irrigation, and was almost empty within a few weeks, he said.

Potable water is used to fill the pond and irrigate the turf there because the city's effluent is already taken.

"We're asking is this the most responsible way to use potable water," said Krahn.

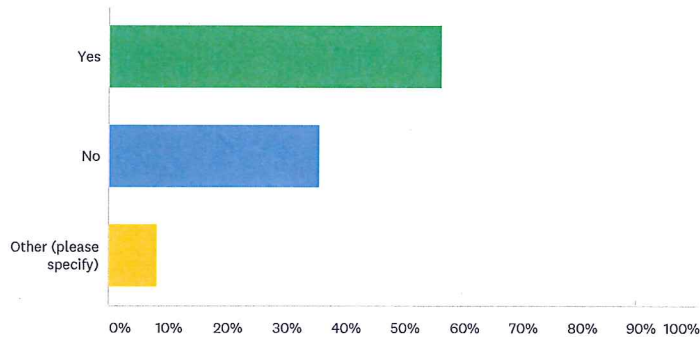

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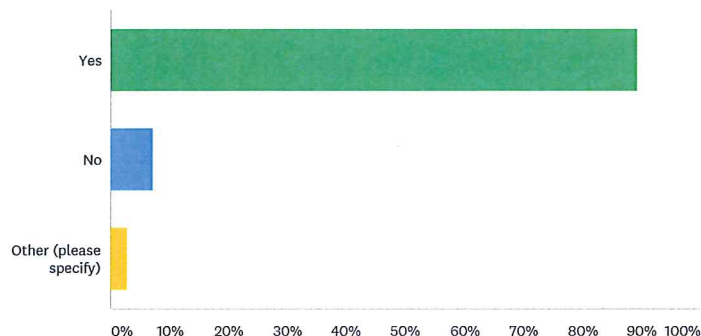

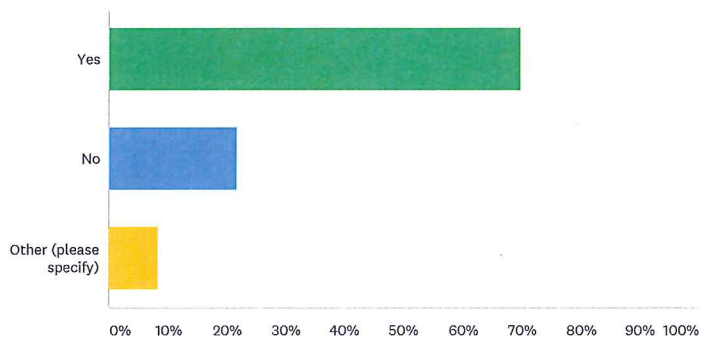

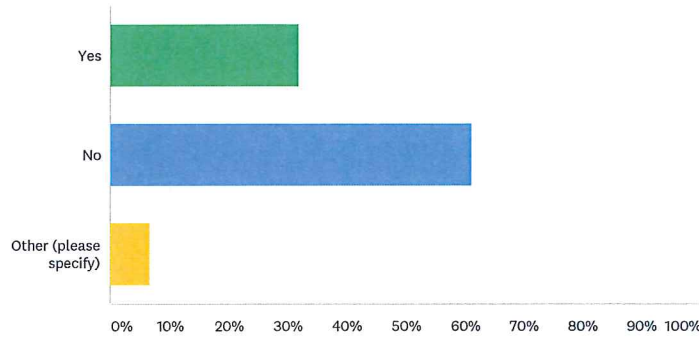


Should the City remove the dirt parking areas along East Overland Street and California Street and provide parallel parking along these streets?

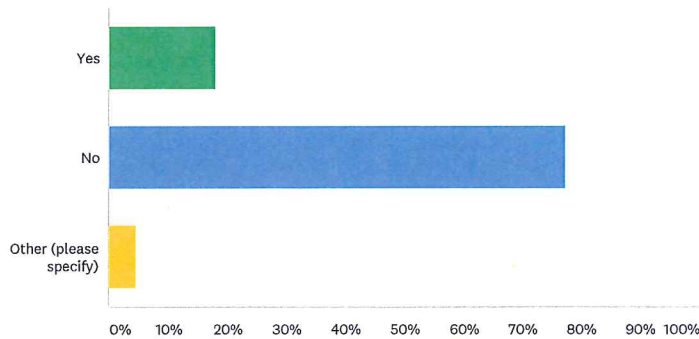

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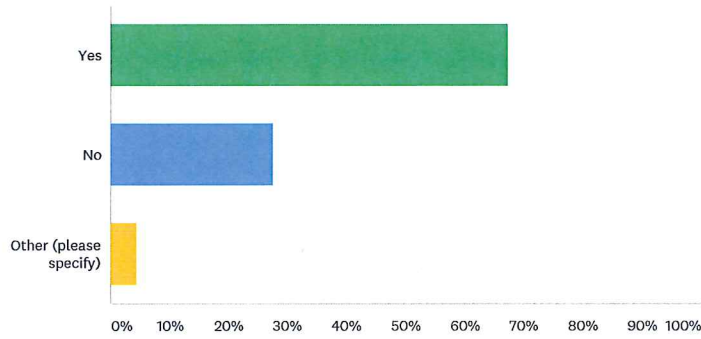

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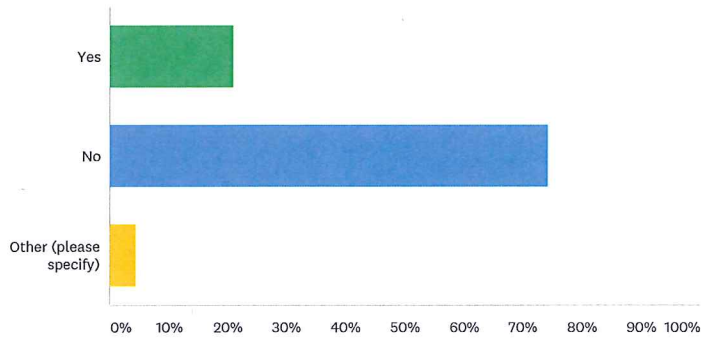

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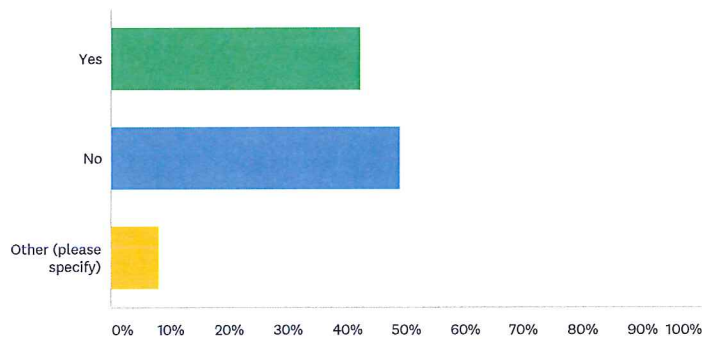

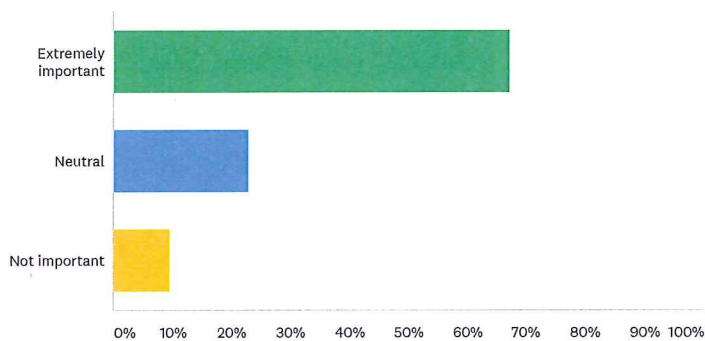
