Background/Issues & Analysis

The Historic Resources Commission would like to recognize the following 2021 Historic Preservation Award recipients for outstanding contribution to historic preservation efforts in Carson City:

The Carson City Culture and Tourism Authority dba Visit Carson City for the interpretative markers on the Kit Carson Trail.

Carson City's West Side Historic District encompasses approximately seventy acres at the historic core of Nevada's capital city. Most of the city's surviving early houses were constructed to the west of Carson Street, where there is a concentration today that forms the historic district. The period of significance begins with the platting of Carson City in 1858 and concludes in 1945 with the shift to post-war architectural traditions.

Until recently, the Kit Carson Trail, a walking tour through the historic district, was marked with a blue line on the sidewalk. Visit Carson City has "refreshed" the Kit Carson Trail by installing sandstone markers on the planting strip in front of forty-seven sites noting historic buildings, homes, churches, and sites throughout the West Side

Historic District. The sandstone pieces are approximately two feet by one foot by eight inches. Each site name is engraved and powder coated on brushed 60/61 aluminum. Repurposed medallions from Carson Street are embedded in each sandstone piece.

Visit Carson City was the lead on this project, and they partnered with Silver State industries, the Carson City Historic Society, and the Carson City Public Works Department to make this vision a reality.
