- Americorps started a version of these programs (2017 – Aug 2019)
- Ranger Tyler took over in September 2019
- Quickly established the programs as park-ranger led programs
- Similar to State and National Park Service Programs
- These have become so much more than just educating the public

What types of Programs do we offer?

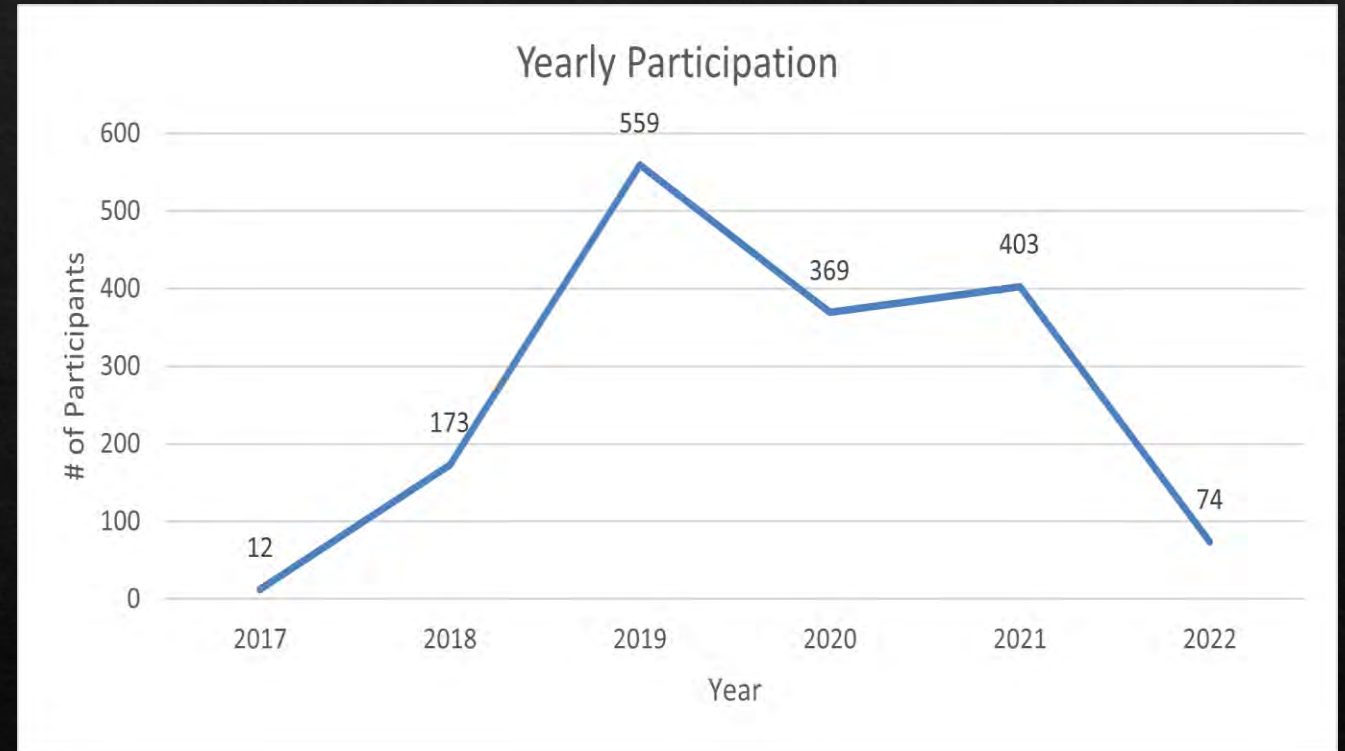
- Natural Resource

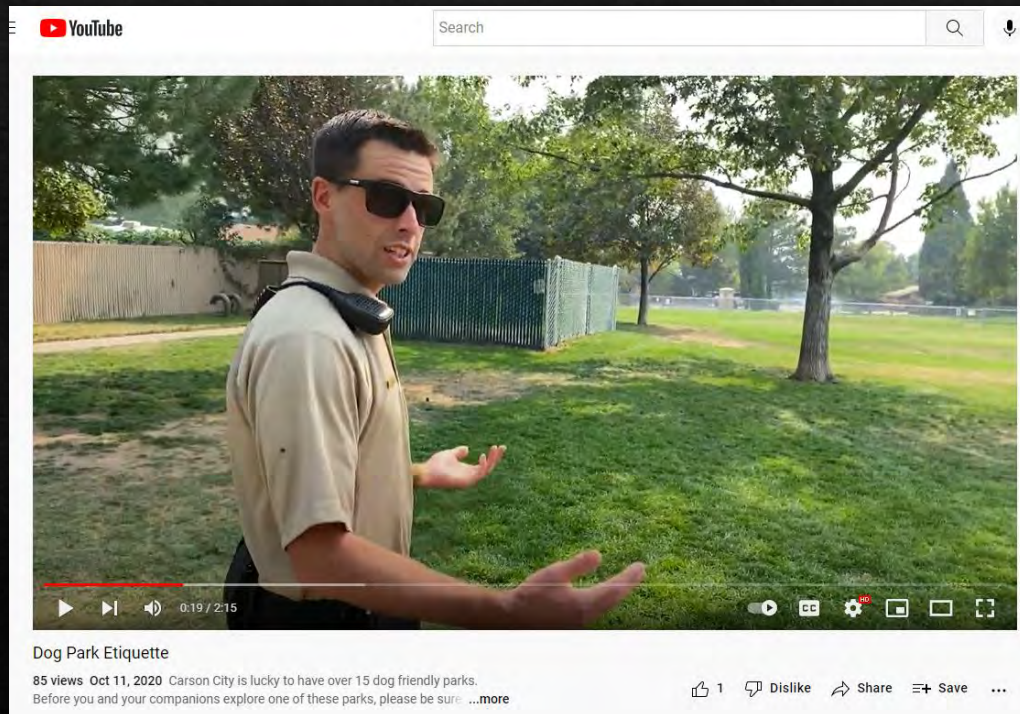

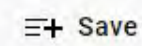
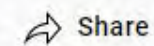

carson_city_parks One of our trail cameras captured this bobcat exploring the Carson City area. Bobcats (*Lynx rufus*) can weigh up to 25 lbs and travel over 30 miles in search of food. They mostly hunt small mammals and will sometimes eat fish and birds.

Remember anytime you see a wild animal, such as this bobcat, to view it safely from a distance and leave it be! 🐾🌲

carson_city_parks This time of year, it's important to be bear aware! One of our Park Rangers encountered this fella scavenging for snacks at Fuji Park last night. If you cross paths with a black bear in one of our parks or open space remember to practice bear safety:

1. Keep a safe distance, never approach a bear.
2. Keep your pets on leash and under control. Allowing your dog to bark at or chase after a black bear is asking for trouble.
3. Shout or bang on loud metal objects to scare it away.
4. If the bear has not ran away, remain calm and back away slowly. Never run!

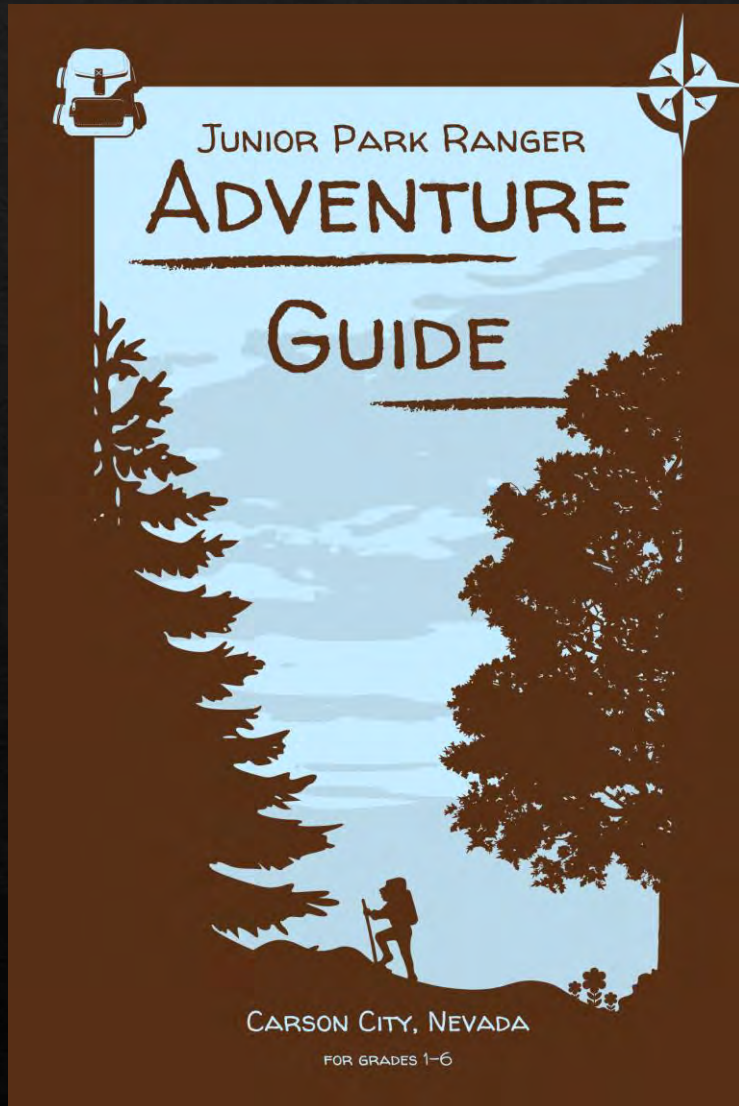

NEVER EAT SOGGY WAFFLES

A JUNIOR PARK RANGER SHOULD ALWAYS KNOW WHERE THEY ARE AND HOW THEY GOT THERE. TWO GREAT TOOLS WE USE TO HELP US WITH THAT ARE A MAP AND A COMPASS. BOTH TOOLS REQUIRE YOU TO KNOW FOUR IMPORTANT DIRECTIONS: NORTH, EAST, SOUTH, AND WEST. A GREAT WAY TO REMEMBER THEM IS BY SAYING, NEVER EAT SOGGY WAFFLES.

THE BEST WAY TO USE BOTH TOOLS IS BY POINTING THE NORTH SYMBOL FROM THE COMPASS ON THE MAP IN THE SAME DIRECTION THAT THE ARROW IS POINTING ON YOUR COMPASS IN YOUR HAND. THE ARROW ON YOUR COMPASS ALWAYS POINTS NORTH. GET WITH A PARK RANGER TO LEARN MORE ABOUT ORIENTEERING.

CARSON RIVER PARK SCAVENGER HUNT

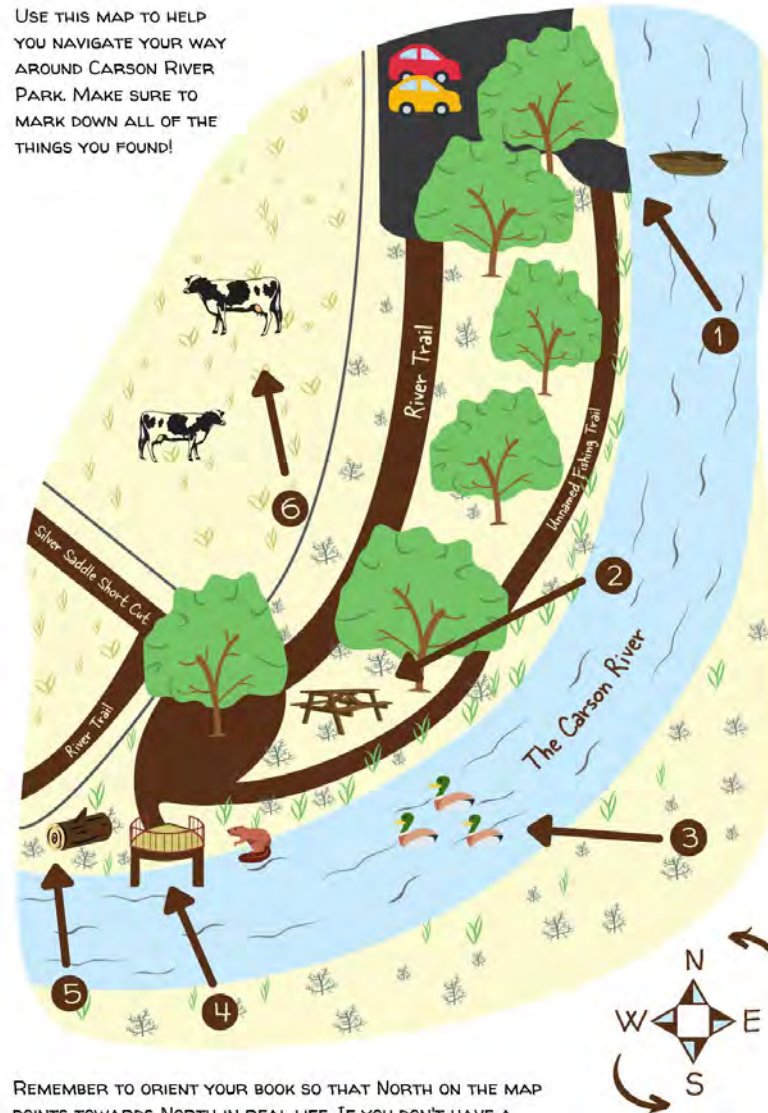
