## EXHIBIT A

### **OPEN SPACE PROGRAM**

*Project Priorities and Work Plan, Fiscal Year 2023-2024*

Only for the Committee's reference, all completed projects will be noted in the 2022 Open Space Annual Report. Projects utilizing grant funding have been highlighted in bold text.

#### **1. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS**

Old Buzzy's Ranch Property	<p>1) In partnership with the <b>Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act (SNPLMA)</b>, staff applied for funding in <b>2020</b> to fund the purchase of approximately 694 acre-feet annually (AFA) of water rights to apply to the wetlands and wet meadow habitat at Buzzy's Ranch, specifically at the Ducks Unlimited wetlands. Funds will also support necessary irrigation improvements and revegetation activities to further enhance the wetland areas. The nomination was approved and signed by the Secretary of the Interior in the fall of 2021, and the funding is available beginning February 1, 2023.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Q18 Quality of Life – Professional Services Account (FY23-24): \$50,000</li><li>- Grant Funding / Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act (SNPLMA): \$1.8 million.</li></ul> <p>2) Roof repair and rehabilitation of the old stone shed. The project has been on hold due to limited staffing and higher priorities but remains a priority for staff to prevent further degradation of the structure.</p>	Lyndsey Boyer
Prison Hill Trail - West	<p>In partnership with the <b>Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act (SNPLMA)</b>, staff applied for funding in <b>2020</b> to design and construct a non-motorized multi-use trail approximately 2.5 miles in length along the west side of Prison Hill and make improvements to the existing Koontz Lane trailhead. The nomination was approved and signed by the Secretary of the Interior in the fall of 2021, and the funding is available beginning February 1, 2023.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Grant Funding / Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act (SNPLMA): \$2.4 million.</li></ul>	Gregg Berggren

Riverview Trailhead	<p>In partnership with the <b>Southern Nevada Public Lands Management Act (SNPLMA)</b>, staff applied for funding in 2021 to design and renovate the trailhead at Riverview Park/Korean War Memorial. Elements will include all new facilities, redesigned parking area, improved trail access, protection of cultural resources, drainage improvements, low-maintenance landscaping, and accessibility enhancements. Interpretive panel content will be created in cooperation with the Carson Water Subconservancy District and the Washoe Tribe of California and Nevada. Clear Creek / Nevada State Lands	The Clear Creek Trail and Trailhead has been an ongoing collaborative project with many different public, private, corporate, and non-profit partners since 2008. An appraisal process was initiated in 2019 and was completed in 2022. Carson City continues to be an involved partner in working with stakeholders to identify a mutually beneficial solution to formalize a trailhead and trail connection at this location. The nomination was strengthened by adding in additional properties in the Sierra front slated for conservation easement. 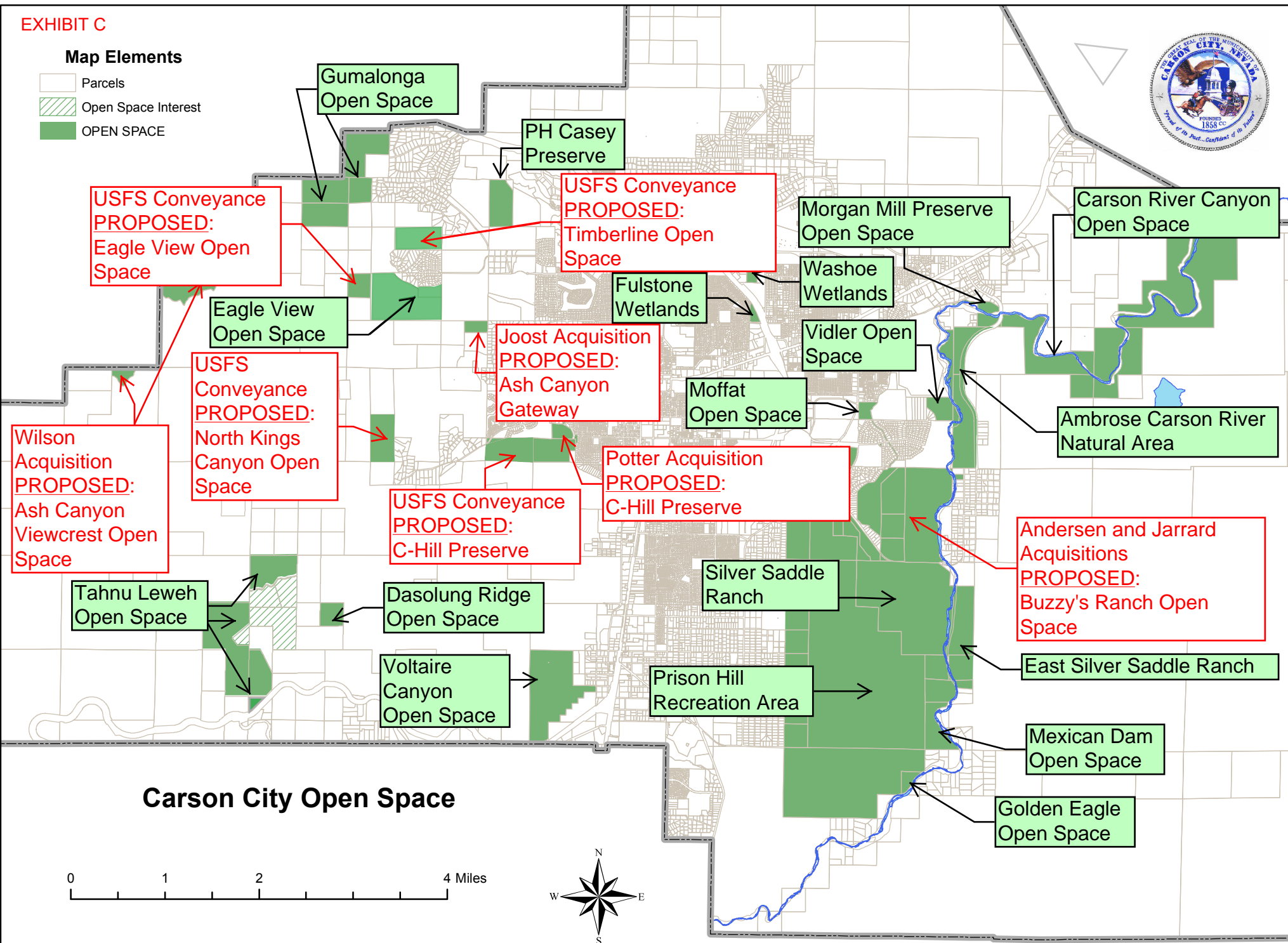
