**3. PUBLIC COMMENT**

(12:01:24) – Chairperson D’Anne entertained public comments. Mr. Brooks thanked the Commission for their support of the Murals and Music Festival and introduced himself as the new Arts and Culture Program Manager for Visit Carson City and the Cultural and Tourism Authority (CTA).

(12:03:16) – Chairperson D’Anne congratulated Mr. Brooks and said the CTA made a “wonderful choice.” She noted that there was positive feedback on the murals. Vice Chair Mowers said she felt the murals were bringing

residents together. Commissioner Drysdale added that there was a “buzz in the air” regarding the murals and noted that the murals made the City appear more “artsy.”

#### **4. FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: APPROVAL OF MINUTES – SEPTEMBER 11, 2023**

(12:04:30) – Chairperson D’Anneo introduced the item and entertained comments, changes, and a motion. Ms. Freeman noted that her title was incorrectly listed as “Arts and Culture Program Manager” instead of “Arts and Culture Program Supervisor” on the September 11, 2023 Minutes.

(12:05:12) – Chairperson D’Anneo called for a vote.

#### **5. MEETING ITEMS:**

##### **5.A FOR POSSIBLE ACTION: DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION REGARDING A RECOMMENDATION TO THE CITY MANAGER CONCERNING PROPOSALS FOR A DOWNTOWN GATEWAY MONUMENT LOCATED IN THE ROUNDABOUT AT THE INTERSECTION OF SOUTH CARSON STREET AND SOUTH STEWART STREET.**

(12:06:29) – Chairperson D’Anneo introduced the item. Ms. Freeman referenced the Staff Report and the three project proposals from artists Curtis Pittman, Michael Szabo, and Karen Yank, all of which are incorporated into the record. Chairperson D’Anneo stated that she and Commissioner Flakus were members of the ad-hoc panel to review the 153 submissions. Ms. Freeman added that the ad-hoc panel included Commission representatives, local artists, an engineer, and several other relevant positions. She referenced the Late Material with the panel’s scores and comments, which is incorporated into the record.

(12:20:00) – Chairperson D’Anneo entertained Commissioner comments. Commissioner Drysdale said she favored Ms. Yank’s piece titled “Sense of Place,” stating that she loved its attention to detail and representation of state elements. She added that the proposal was “beautiful” and recommended that the City place a marker near the monument to indicate the best angle for photos.

(12:21:59) – Commissioner Smith stated that the three proposals looked “great” but he was drawn to Mr. Szabo’s proposal called “Willows” because it represented community and togetherness. He added that although the monument did not represent “descriptive adjectives of Carson City,” he liked that it would be illuminated at night and said it was “a beacon of hope.”

(12:23:43) – Vice Chair Mowers said she felt that a majority of citizens would be proud to see Ms. Yank’s piece since it represented the City and the state. She added that it was “intriguing” and “interesting” and had “really great motifs.”

(12:24:39) – Commissioner Moore said she appreciated the panelists’ comments and stated that she preferred Ms. Yank’s piece. She referenced the Late Material and said she agreed with Panelist #6’s comment on removing the eagle from the piece because it was distracting.

(12:25:08) – Commissioner Horton noted that all three artists were “very talented” but said it was clear that Ms. Yank “did her homework” by capturing the history and culture of Carson City.

(12:26:06) – Chairperson D’Anneio said the three proposals were “terrific.” She noted that Mr. Pittman and Mr. Szabo’s pieces could be placed “anywhere in the world” while Ms. Yank’s monument clearly represented Carson City. Chairperson D’Anneio added that she liked the Native American scroll and the symbolism of the round piece. She said she felt impartial about the inclusion of the eagle and stated that Ms. Yank’s piece captured “both sides of the corridor.”

(12:34:13) – Commissioner Smith requested that the Commission revisit the Redevelopment Authority Citizens Committee (RACC) grant rubric as a future agenda item. Chair D’Anneio agreed with Commissioner Smith, stating that the matter was important because it was “very confusing for everybody.”

(12:35:56) – Commissioner Smith announced that the third Annual Black History Program at Western Nevada College was scheduled for Thursday, February 15, 2024, with the theme “African American and the Arts.”
