HOW YOU CAN VOTE

Option 1 – Vote by Mail

If you are an active registered voter who did not opt out and are affiliated with a major political party, you will receive a mail ballot.

Your ballot will be mailed on or about May 11, 2026.

Your ballot packet includes an instruction sheet. It explains:

- What color of ink pen should be used for ballot scanners?
- How to make your choice.
- What to do if you make an error.
- How to return your ballot to us.

If your envelope says, 'ID Required,' include a photocopy of your Nevada ID.

Return Deadlines:

- Mail: Postmarked by June 9, 2026, and received by June 13, 2026.
- Drop Box: by the close of polls on June 9, 2026.
- Only one ballot is permitted per envelope.
- Track your ballot: myballot.nv.gov

Option 2 – Vote Early in Person

Location: Carson City Community Center Gymnasium-851 E. William St.

Dates: Saturday, May 23 – Friday, June 5, 2026.

Closed May 25 in observance of Memorial Day

Hours:

- Weekdays: 9:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.
- Saturdays (May 23 & 30): 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

In-Person Voting

Voting equipment instructions will be posted at every polling place, and trained election workers will be available to help you at any time.

When you arrive, you will check in on a poll pad and receive a blank ballot. You will take that ballot to the ballot-marking device to make your selections. When you are finished, you will place your completed ballot into the tabulator so your vote can be counted.

Voting More Than Once

We can count only one ballot from each voter. If more than one ballot is returned, only the first valid ballot will be counted. Nevada law allows you to vote only once in each election. Voting more than once, or attempting to do so, is a felony.

Key Dates

- May 12 – Last day to register by paper
- May 23 – June 5: Early Voting
- June 9 – Election Day
- June 13 – Deadline to receive postmarked ballots
- June 15 – Signature cure deadline
- June 18 – Canvass of the vote

Need Help?

Carson City is committed to ensuring that all voters have equal access to election information, materials, and voting locations.

Polling Location Accessibility

- All polling locations meet ADA standards.
- Each site includes at least one accessible voting system, as required by federal law.
- Election workers are trained to provide reasonable accommodation.

Language Access

Understanding Nonpartisan Races in the 2026 Carson City Primary Election

What is happening in this election?

All local nonpartisan races have two or fewer candidates, so they will not appear on the Primary ballot. These races will be decided in the General Election.

Nonpartisan candidates running for partisan offices

These candidates do not take part in party primaries. If they qualify, they will appear on the General Election ballot.

What does this mean for you?

Your Primary ballot may not include some races. Those races will appear on the General Election ballot.
