April Recap



On Saturday April 11th, the CCPROS Department and River Wranglers hosted an America250 NV Workday! 17 volunteers from Carson High School NJROTC joined us to help with Cottonwood Tree protection by wrapping some of the trees with wire fencing and painting some with a sand and paint mixture.

Also on Saturday April 11th 26 volunteers from Battle Born Offroad Club, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit rooted in adventure, community and responsible off-roading across Northern Nevada, came together to clean up their adopted Summit Loop in the Prison Hill OHV Area.



On Saturday April 18th the CCPROS Department hosted a community-wide Trash Bash in celebration of Earth Day! 96 volunteers in total from groups like Home Depot, Click Bond, Polka Dot Powerhouse, Lions Club, Muscle Powered, the Filth Fighters, and many individual volunteers were assigned to different sites around Carson City to clean up trash, dog waste, and even weeds!

13 Carson High School students from NJROTC joined staff again on Sunday April 26th for a workday along their adopted section of the Linear Ditch Trail! Students collected 12 large bags worth of weeds, dog waste, and trash from in and around the ditch.

On Saturday April 18th Carson City Park Rangers led a hike up Prison Hill where participants got to learn all about the history of the Great Basin and see lots of cool wildflowers along the way!



For April's Read with a Ranger program, we had a special guest! Open Space Manager and Queen Bee Lyndsey Boyer led this fun program with books all about bees, and then participants had the chance to do pollinator themed crafts.



Sheep Updates!



They're baaaaaack!

Since 2006, sheep have annually grazed the west side of Carson City for fuels reduction, including highly flammable grasses and shrubs - and 2026 marks year 20! The north band of sheep, located behind Western Nevada College, has completed their grazing. The south band is currently located in the C-Hill/Kings Canyon area, and will continue to graze open areas behind homes and on the hillsides through May. Please remember:

- When hiking in the vicinity of sheep, always keep your dog leashed to keep both the sheep and your dog safe. There are livestock guardian dogs who are trained to protect the sheep and are with them at all times.
- Pay attention to posted signage notifying if sheep are present in an area, especially at trailheads and trails you frequent.
- Alternative hiking locations include our east-side trails, generally in the locations of Prison Hill Recreation Area and throughout the Carson River Corridor. Visit carsoncity.gov/trails for more information on alternative trails.

ADA Improvements to the exterior NE corner entrance are currently in progress and are just waiting on handrails.

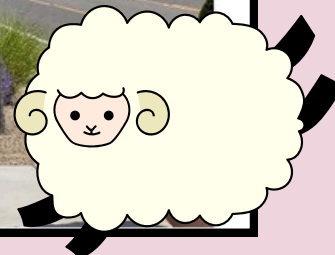


Monte Vista Park:

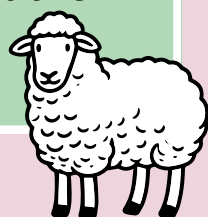
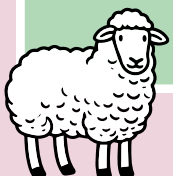
Park Ambassador Program

ADOPT-A-SPOT



The Adopt-A-Spot program is an environmental stewardship initiative and a chance for businesses, clubs, families, schools, and other citizen groups to give back to Carson City community by helping with care and maintenance of a trail, park or section of the Lone Mountain Cemetery. This program aims to build civic pride and involve community members in positive outdoor recreation.

Groups who adopt a spot enter into a partnership with Carson City Parks, Recreation & Open Space. Adopting groups are required to coordinate a minimum of two volunteer events per year at the spot of their choosing. Volunteer events will include activities based on their site needs, but may include: trash and dog waste clean-up, trail brushing, and weed pulling.



A sign will be placed at the trailhead or park in recognition of the group's partnership and commitment!

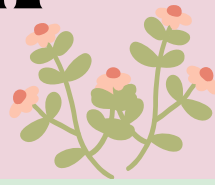
- Weed removal

Mosquito Season Is Here

Take the 1-Minute Yard Check

WHY IT MATTERS!

Female mosquitoes can spread diseases like West Nile virus and can develop in just 7-10 days in standing water.



WEEKLY CHECKLIST

- Dump standing water
- Refresh birdbath & pet water
- Clear gutters and drains
- Empty tarps, covers, and outdoor items
- Store or flip items outside
- Maintain pools

Take the Challenge-Start on Your Property

Property owners play an important role and are responsible for maintaining vector control and preventing mosquito breeding on their property, including eliminating standing water and maintaining outdoor areas and water features.

PROTECT YOURSELF

- Use EPA- registered insect repellent when outdoors. Wear long sleeves & pants. Use window and door screens. Avoid dawn and dusk when mosquitoes are most active.



★ Did You Know?

- Only female mosquitoes bite.
- Mosquitoes are attracted to body heat and carbon dioxide.
- Mosquitoes can smell you from up to 100 feet away.

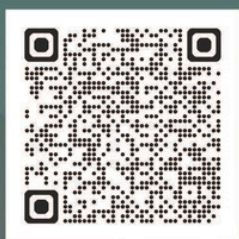

Quality of Life Initiative - 30 Years!

Parks & Open Space Maintenance Staff

20% of Quality of Life funding is dedicated to parks maintenance. This is critical support for equipment, projects, and staffing. This enables the Department to save significantly by completing many projects in-house. Recently, staff completed renovation of field 3 at Governors Field. This project included laser leveling the field, new underground drainage, irrigation system, soil layer, sod, and infield playing surface. Field 3 has been closed and unplayable at times due to previous issues related to a high-water table and aging infrastructure. Parks Maintenance:

- Purchases critical equipment such as mowers, tractors, mini excavators, aerifiers, and spreaders.
- Helps to ensure local sports programs, regional tournaments, and events continue to thrive and support the local economy.
- Hires 15-20 Trustees from the Nevada Department of Corrections to help with parks maintenance, which helps to save thousands of dollars annually in labor costs.
- Oversees 29 parks, 61 non-park sites, and 18 playgrounds.
- Takes care of 1212.5 developed acres, approximately 17+ acres per full-time employee.
- Has many talented people who bring in expertise in the care and maintenance of parks, playgrounds, landscapes, irrigation, fairgrounds, trees, shrubs, and sports fields.
- Includes 17 full-time employees:
 - Park Operations Manager, Parks Supervisor, Parks Crew Coordinator, Parks Coordinator, Sports Fields Coordinator, Irrigation Specialist, Parks Maintenance Workers I & II.

Parks & Open Space Maintenance Staff

The Open Space Division manages over 7,000 acres, and with just three full time and one part-time staff responsible for maintenance that's a lot of acres be person (2,465 per person to be exact)! Our maintenance team is made up of Bob Tonseth, Open Space Foreman, and Joe Steele and Kyle Vonderwerth who are Parks Maintenance Workers assigned to Open Space. Nancy McMillen is our part-time Trailhead Caretaker. Together, our team is responsible for boots on the ground maintenance of your Open Spaces. These Carson City owned public lands require a unique skill set to care for. Our team is responsible for trail maintenance, restoration, and revegetation, fuels reduction, noxious and nuisance weed abatement, sign installation, fence repair, and caring for historic properties like Silver Saddle Ranch. This small but mighty team are dedicated, knowledgeable and passionate about natural resources and caring for our local environment. 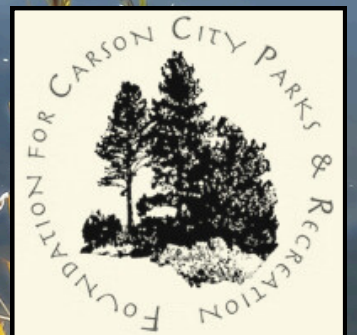
ABOUT
